- The Baby-Friendly Council of NL is a government funded organization with a mission to:
  - Protect, promote and support breastfeeding in Newfoundland and Labrador.
  - Improve the health of Newfoundlanders and Labradorians by providing leadership and support for the implementation of the World Health Organization's Baby-Friendly Initiative. - This year during World Breastfeeding Week the Baby-Friendly Council of NL recognizes the potential environmental and economic consequences of not breastfeeding. We need to better understand the impact of different infant feeding methods on planetary health in both normal and emergency situations. Climate change and environmental degradation are critical challenges facing our world today.

- We can all do something to minimize our carbon footprint starting with how we feed our infants and young children. Breastfeeding is one of the many sustainable solutions to planetary health. <u>#BreastmilkIsaNaturalResource</u>
  - Breastmilk is a natural resource, it is environmentally safe and green because it is produced and delivered without pollution, packaging or waste.
  - Breastfeeding helps the transition to a low-carbon economy from one based on fossil fuels. No electricity is needed to produce breastmilk and it requires no fuel for transport, thus reducing emissions of carbon dioxide, the principal greenhouse gas.
  - During an environmental disaster or a public health emergency there may be changes to our food supply chain including decreases in production of goods and services. Breastfeeding is a local, sustainable and available resource.
  - Breastfeeding saves energy as it only requires the extra energy that a mom needs to consume, therefore using fewer natural resources.
  - Breastmilk substitutes and industrially produced complementary foods leave a
    major ecological footprint. Energy is needed to manufacture materials for
    packaging, fuel for transport and retailing, fuel, water and cleaning agents for
    daily preparation and are fed from plastic bottles and containers. More than
    4,000 litres of water are estimated to be needed along the production lines to
    produce just 1 kg of powdered breastmilk substitute.

- The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic may also leave families in a vulnerable position with regards to infant feeding.
  - In every emergency, it is necessary to assess and act to protect and support the nutritional needs and care of both breastfed and non-breastfed infants and young children. - Breastfeeding also supports improved food security for families.

  - Breastmilk is a safe, sufficient and nutritious food that is uniquely customized to meet the dietary needs of infants. Once complementary foods are added to the diet at 6 months of age, breastmilk can continue to provide important nutrients and hydration up to 2 years and beyond.

- By breastfeeding infants and young children, family resources can be directed away from purchasing breastmilk substitutes to support other food needs in the household.
- Healthier breastfed infants can save family resources by avoiding health care costs, lost work time and healthcare visits.
- Over the past decade an increasing number of NL families are breastfeeding.
   Provincial perinatal statistics show that breastfeeding initiation rates in hospital have gone from approximately one-third of women in the late 1970's to over three-quarters of women in recent years.
- Breastfeeding requires supportive measures at all levels of society, from legal and policy directives to social attitudes and values, work and employment conditions, family support, knowledge and healthcare services.

# Proclamation World Breastfeeding Week October 1 – 7, 2020



Whereas Breastfeeding has an impact on lifelong health. Exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months of life with continued breastfeeding up to 2 years and beyond ensures that mothers, children and communities receive maximum health benefits; and Whereas Breastfeeding is one of the most cost-effective prevention strategies for many infections and chronic and acute diseases: and Whereas The theme for World Breastfeeding Week 2020 in Newfoundland and Labrador is "Support Breastfeeding for a Healthier Planet". This theme highlights the impact of infant feeding on the environment with respect to climate change and the need to protect, promote, and support breastfeeding for the health of the planet and its people; and Whereas World Breastfeeding Week provides an opportunity for people to celebrate and to raise public awareness about the health, economic and environmental importance of breastfeeding; and Whereas Breastfeeding is normal, natural, environmentally safe and green because it is produced and delivered without pollution, packaging or waste; and Whereas Breastfeeding supports improved food security for families, especially during times of public health or environmental emergencies: and Whereas Breastfeeding requires supportive measures at all levels of society, from legal and policy directives to social attitudes and values, work and employment conditions, family support, knowledge and healthcare services. proclaim October 1 to 7, 2020 "World Breastfeeding Week" in
